### Collect for The Thirteenth Sunday after Trinity

Almighty God, who called your Church to bear witness that you were in Christ reconciling the world to yourself: help us to proclaim the good news of your love, that all who hear it may be drawn to you; through him who was lifted up on the cross, and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

### A Psalm for Trinity 13, Psalm 15

**Refrain: Through the greatness of your mercy, I will come into your house.**

Lord, who may dwell in your tabernacle? Who may rest upon your holy hill?  
Whoever leads an uncorrupt life and does the thing that is right;  
Who speaks the truth from the heart and bears no deceit on the tongue. [R]  
Who does no evil to a friend and pours no scorn on a neighbour;  
In whose sight the wicked are not esteemed, but who honours those who fear the Lord. [R]  
Whoever has sworn to a neighbour and never goes back on that word;  
Who does not lend money in hope of gain, nor takes a bribe against the innocent;  
Whoever does these things shall never fall. [R]

### Gospel for The Thirteenth Sunday after Trinity, Mark 7. 1-8, 14-15, 21-23

Now when the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) So the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?' He said to them, 'Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written, "This people honours me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines." You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition.' ...

... Then he called the crowd again and said to them, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand: there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile.' For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person.'

### Collect for The Fourteenth Sunday after Trinity

Almighty God, whose only Son has opened for us a new and living way into your presence: give us pure hearts and steadfast wills to worship you in spirit and in truth; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

### A Psalm for Trinity 14, Psalm 146

**Refrain: The Lord shall reign for ever.**

Alleluia. Praise the Lord, O my soul: while I live will I praise the Lord;  
as long as I have any being, I will sing praises to my God.  
Put not your trust in princes, nor in any human power, for there is no help in them.  
When their breath goes forth, they return to the earth; on that day all their thoughts perish. [R]  
Happy are those who have the God of Jacob for their help, whose hope is in the Lord their God;  
Who made heaven and earth, the sea and all that is in them; who keeps his promise for ever;  
Who gives justice to those that suffer wrong and bread to those who hunger. [R]  
The Lord looses those that are bound; the Lord opens the eyes of the blind;  
The Lord lifts up those who are bowed down; the Lord loves the righteous;  
The Lord watches over the stranger in the land; he upholds the orphan and widow;  
but the way of the wicked he turns upside down.  
The Lord shall reign for ever, your God, O Zion, throughout all generations. Alleluia. [R]

### Gospel for The Fourteenth Sunday after Trinity, Mark 7. 24-end

From there he set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. He said to her, 'Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' But she answered him, 'Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs.' Then he said to her, 'For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter.' So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone. Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, 'He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.'
