Almighty God, whose only Son has opened for us a new and living way into your presence: give us pure hearts and steadfast wills to worship you in spirit and in truth; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

#### A Psalm for today, Psalm 149

#### Refrain: Sound praises to the Lord, all the earth.

Alleluia. O sing to the Lord a new song;

sing his praise in the congregation of the faithful.

Let Israel rejoice in their maker; let the children of Zion be joyful in their king. Let them praise his name in the dance;

let them sing praise to him with timbrel and lyre.

For the Lord has pleasure in his people and adorns the poor with salvation. **[R]** Let the faithful be joyful in glory; let them rejoice in their ranks,

With the praises of God in their mouths and a two-edged sword in their hands;

To execute vengeance on the nations and punishment on the peoples;

To bind their kings in chains and their nobles with fetters of iron;

To execute on them the judgement decreed:

#### A Gospel reading for today, Matthew 18. 15-20

Jesus said, 'If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax-collector. Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.'
