The Apostles' Creed

Our services until 1st December will feature hymns, readings, prayers and preaching enabling us to explore articles of the Apostles' Creed. Hopefully our worship will take us a bit more deeply into what we believe, why it matters, and how it can shape our lives.

This week we continue with, 'I believe in Jesus Christ: who shall come to judge the quick and the dead.'

A Psalm for today, Psalm 7, 1-11

Refrain: Give judgement for me according to my righteousness, O Lord.

O Lord my God, in you I take refuge;

save me from all who pursue me, and deliver me,

Lest they rend me like a lion and tear me in pieces while there is no one to help me. O Lord my God, if I have done these things: if there is any wickedness in my hands,

If I have repaid my friend with evil, or plundered my enemy without a cause,

Then let my enemy pursue me and overtake me,

trample my life to the ground, and lay my honour in the dust. [R]

Rise up, O Lord, in your wrath; lift yourself up against the fury of my enemies.

Awaken, my God, the judgement that you have commanded.

Let the assembly of the peoples gather round you;

be seated high above them: O Lord, judge the nations. [R]

Give judgement for me according to my righteousness, O Lord,

and according to the innocence that is in me.

Let the malice of the wicked come to an end, but establish the righteous:

for you test the mind and heart, O righteous God.

God is my shield that is over me; he saves the true of heart.

God is a righteous judge; he is provoked all day long. [R]

Sunday 17th November 2024 Second Sunday before Advent



A Gospel reading for today, Matthew 13. 24-30

Jesus put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The slaves said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.'"

Collect for The Second Sunday before Advent

Heavenly Father, whose blessed Son was revealed to destroy the works of the devil and to make us the children of God and heirs of eternal life: grant that we, having this hope, may purify ourselves even as he is pure; that when he shall appear in power and great glory we may be made like him in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where he is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.
