Harvest, Sunday 5th October – We'll celebrate Harvest at 8am and 10am services. There will be a Red Bucket for the Bishop's Appeal, Rewrite their future. This year the diocese lis partnering with Mission Direct who are working towards increasing access to education for some of the world's most under-resourced communities. In Uganda and Zambia alone, Mission Direct will help over 1,170 children this year to have access to a new classroom, and over the next 20 vears these new facilities will be used by 23,400 children. We're also requesting food gifts for Bishop's Stortford Food Bank.
