
A Gospel reading for today, Matthew 19. 27-30

Peter said, 'Look, we have left everything and followed you. What then will we have?' Jesus said to them, 'Truly I tell you, at the renewal of all things, when the Son of Man is seated on the throne of his glory, you who have followed me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or fields, for my name's sake, will receive a hundredfold, and will inherit eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.'

CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

Come and share our short session for children and young people during our **Sunday 10am service EVERY WEEK!**

We invite children of all ages, with their adults, to come into the Lady Chapel during part of the service, and share in A Godly Play (a short visual storytelling of scriptures, with wondering questions, stories, crafts, puzzles, and even some acting for those that want ... for all ages to share together; then various age related activities). **We also have an older group breakout session most weeks.** We continue our series exploring Jesus' early life and beginning work. This week we hear about the wedding at Cana (*John 2. 1-11*), discovering that God cares about his people and knows what help we need.



Last week we heard how Jesus called his first disciples (*Matthew 4. 18-23*) and how Jesus wants us to be in his team. We worked as a team with a balloon race, hunted round the room for cards with the 12 disciples, and made paper chains as friends of Jesus.


